For the regiment's gallantry at the battle of Friedland, Czar Alexander I ordered the regiment to retain their caps "in the state in which they left the battlefield as a visible mark of its bravery and Our grace." In 1813, in commemoration of their service during the 1812 war with Napoleon, the regiment was incorporated into the Imperial Life-Guards. Not only did the style of caps survive without any changes until 1917 (beside of the late 19th century addition of the Guard's star and Turkish war award scroll to the front plate of the cap), but the frontal parts from retired caps were carefully preserved and mounted on the new caps. Mitres with bullet holes from the time of Napoleonic wars were preserved with the name of the original wearer permanently stamped on the front. Over 600 of the caps originally worn at Friedland were still in use at the time of the Great War.

Unlike other Life-Guards regiments, this unit had a Reservists cross cockade instead of the usual St. Andrew star. The battalion was exclusively formed from snub-nosed soldiers with unibrow and stationed in Tsarskoe Selo near the Imperial family's Summer residence.

Each helmet was richly decorated at great expense to imitate traditional 18th century Circassian examples. Officers of the unit received a more richly decorated Taj type helmet while private cavalrymen received a Misiurka type. The half-squadron original uniforms were in use by every member of the squadron until 1882, after that only natives of the Northern Georgian region of Kabarda wore the uniform which became known as "historical."
